Thank you Mark Williams

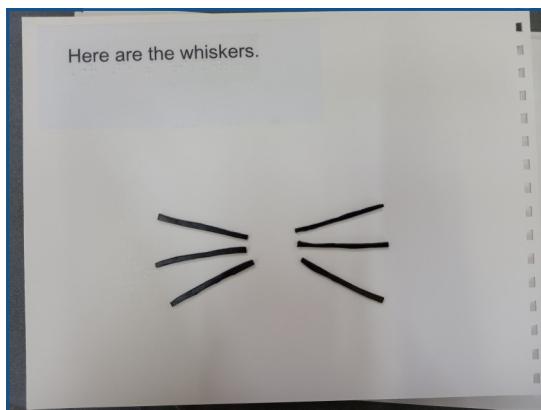

By all accounts, previous books completed by the Selwyn Cause Corps team have been very popular with the Blind Low Vision community and we hope this new book will again, be regularly checked out for lending.
