

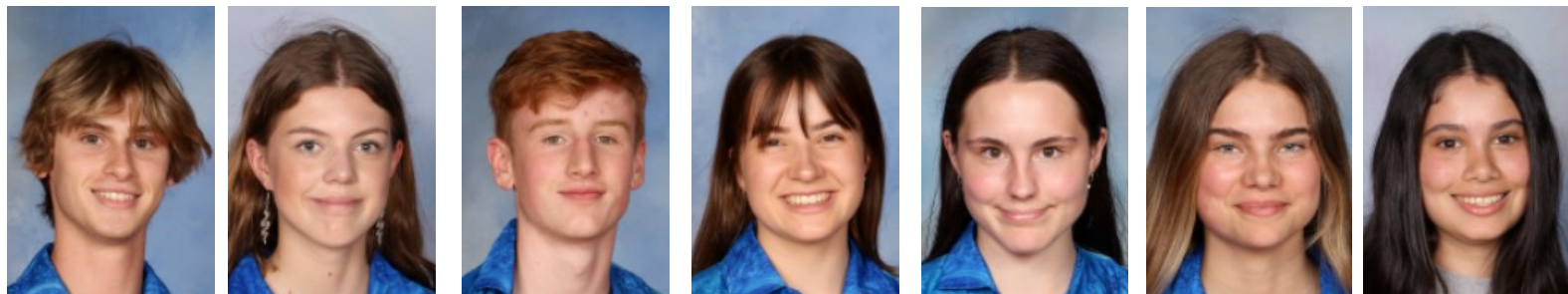

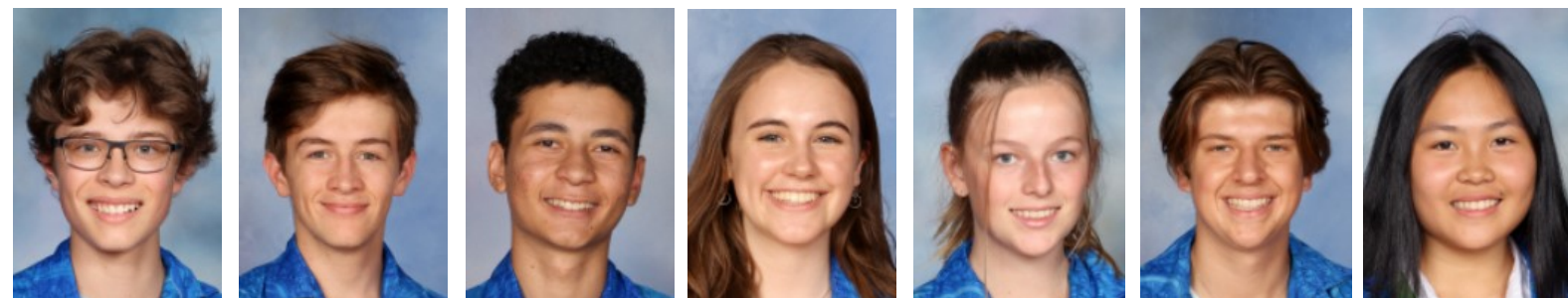

Reforming the Criminal Justice System with Professor Warren Brookbanks from AUT

The presentation will look at changes that have occurred or are occurring in the New Zealand criminal justice system in response to the rising prison population; and the challenges presented by substance abuse, especially methamphetamine.
